Ronnie W. Russell First African American Head Coach Person High School

Mr. Ronnie Russell still regarded as Coach Russell by many was the first African American Head Coach at Person High School in Roxboro, N.C., began his coaching career in 1976 as an assistant coach at the Middle School in Person County. He was always athletic and played football in high school. Mr. Russell continued his athletic career playing football and basketball in college at Elizabeth City State University, Elizabeth City, NC. Coach Russell says his coaching philosophies are team discipline, hard work, dedication and pride in and for the game.

When Coach Russell was asked about the challenges that came with being the first Africain American Head Coach at Person High School he stated, "I kept the challenges to a minimum by always doing things by the book." He also stated he learned from some of the best like Coach Reid Davis and Coach Tommy Day, taking their expertise and adding to his technique this made for a winning combination. Coach Russell stated that he was a "defense- minded coach" because good offense will win games, but great defense wins championships."

When asked about the different challenges of today as it relates to coaching, Russell stated that the style of play has changed, team members don't really want to be coached anymore. Coach Russell declares that team unity starts with a good line of communication between the coach and the players. From there working together as a group with everyone having the same purpose while aiming for the same goal as all are committed to functioning as ONE.

One of Coach Russell's greatest accomplishments was competing in the West Regionals where he played against Chris Paul at West Forsythe High School. Mr. Russell functioned as the Assistant Coach in the East-West Allstar Game in 2004 with some of basketballs greatest athletes like Shaquille O'Neal of the Los Angeles Lakers, Vince Carter, Jason Kidd, Allen Iverson, and Tracy McGrady to name a few. Coach Russell coached a total of 43 years before retiring. He has won several championships, 4 conference championships, and Coach of the Year numerous times. We salute Coach Ronnie W. Russell, first African American Head Coach at Person High School.






3D Mammograms

The Duke Eye Center offers a Remote Diagnosis Screening van to make it easy for you to get your diabetes retinal eye exam. The mobile testing center will be in both urban and rural locations across the state, so you have a convenient, easy option for this important annual screening.
